HIS WORD TODAY *by Rev. William J. Reilly*

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 11, 2010

"There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test him and said, 'Teacher what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'What is written in the law? How do you read it?' He said in reply, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.' He replied to him, 'You have answered correctly; do this and you will live.' ... 'And who is my neighbor?'"

Jesus the story teller portrayed the great message of the Good Samaritan. We know of the figures of the man, the robbers, the priest, the Levite and the Samaritan. Each one, like the scholar who asked the question were able to justify themselves. One had the courage to put the word of God into practice.

The person who asked the question already knew the biblical answer, but he was quite far from practicing it. The alien, the foreigner, the despised one, responded with the expression of love of God in all its aspects.

The law of the first testament of love of God and neighbor is like the coin in your pocket. It has two sides. Think of heads as love of God and tails as that love expressing our concern for the Christ in need. Paul tells us today that "Christ Jesus is the image of the invisibly God..." He became human to show us His face, not just in Palestine twenty centuries ago, but in those worthy of His love present among us.

Reading the story of the Good Samaritan Jesus asks me too "How do you read it?"

Pro Life representatives will be reciting the Rosary Tuesday, July 13th in the Prayer Garden. In case of inclement weather, the rosary will be said in the church.

Scripture Sessions to be in August at Good Shepherd:

Fr. McHugh will offer 2 special August scripture sessions on Thursday morning August 5th and Tuesday morning August 10th at Good Shepherd. This is something extra and is not part of the regular Fall program. The sessions will be dedicated to the memory of Fr. Robert Barone. Sessions will be similar to the regular program and will begin at 9:00 A.M. and last 1½ to 2 hours with refreshment break included. The topic for both sessions will be "Key Questions in Christology". If sufficient interest is shown I will try to duplicate the sessions at St. John Bosco but I am conducting RCIA sessions this summer at SJB. Fall sessions will be held at both churches on Thursdays and topics will be listed in mid August. For the August 5th and 10th sessions at GSC "Key Questions in Christology" will include:

1. Do the Gospels present an accurate factual account of the teaching and deeds of Jesus?
2. How much can we know about the "Jesus of History"?
3. Do the Apocryphal Gospels tell us anything important about Jesus?
4. How historical are the Infancy Gospels?
5. How are the Gospel accounts of Jesus' Baptism to be understood?
6. How are the Gospel accounts of Jesus' Temptations to be understood?
7. What Gospel themes best represent Jesus' teaching?
8. How are the miracles of Jesus to be interpreted?
9. Who bears the most responsibility for Jesus' death?
10. How are Jesus' Sayings, Parables and sermon on the Mount and on the Plain to be interpreted?
11. Why do some people raise the question "Did Jesus found the church"?
12. Are there different Christologies in the New Testament?

Depending on the time element, we will treat as many of these questions as possible and perhaps address several more. We encourage those who have supported the program so well in the past to continue to do so and invite others to give this program a chance. College and older high school students are welcome as well as non-parishioners and people of different faiths. As the hymn goes "**All are welcome in this place.**"
